
Our Spring and Holiday dinners are on for this year!! Plan to join us. See page 8 for the details.

Travel Tips for Contacting Global Assist

It's crucial to follow specific steps to get assistance and stay connected. Before travelling, ensure that your cell phone is set up for roaming and international use in case of emergencies. Contact your cellular provider for guidance beforehand. Additionally, consider the reliability of landlines, especially in destinations where outbound collect calls might be restricted, such as Cuba or on international cruises.

When making a call using a mobile phone, replace the international call prefix with "+" sign. For instance, +1-877-346-1467. Another option for you is to download the **Travel Aid** app. This app includes has a **Contact Us** option to automatically dial Global Excel.

If phoning is not an option, you can email Global Excel at <u>assistance@globalexcel.com</u> with a call-back number.

Prior authorization from a physician — required annually for some diabetes-management and weight-loss medications


Drug Optimization Program (DOP) — designed to help manage prescription drugs costs.

Proposed Organizational Name Change Rosanne Orcutt

RTOERO Directors in Toronto have decided that our legally incorporated name, "The Retired Teachers of Ontario (RTO) / Les enseignantes etenseignants retraités de l'Ontario (ERO)" must be changed in order to increase our membership. Their first effort at the name change was defeated in 2019. Now they are proposing that we become, "Entente Education Canada." As Bert mentioned earlier in this newsletter, the vote will take place at the Spring Forum in May. Our members will not vote in favour of this motion.

Our Executive has proposed and sent a motion for the May 2025 meeting which says that the name of our corporation remain as it was legally incorporated until at least 2030. If the Directors' motion is passed, our motion will be deemed moot. If the Directors' motion is defeated, then our motion should come to the floor for a vote.
