Long Term Care Planning - Some Things to Consider

Long term care is a variety of services to help with activities of daily living (ALDs) and accommodation provided to people with a chronic illness, disability or cognitive impairment such as Alzheimer's disease - the opposite of acute care. It is intended to help a person maintain optimal functioning - not cure medical problems: care not cure. This can take place in a home, hospital or long-term care facility.

ADLs encompasses

- Bathing: Washing the body, including showering or bathing.
- Dressing: Putting on and taking off clothes.
- Eating: Feeding oneself.
- Mobility/Transferring: Moving from one place to another, such as getting in and out of bed or a chair.
- Toileting: Managing bowel and bladder functions, including getting to and from the toilet and maintaining personal hygiene.
- Continence: Maintaining control over bladder and bowel functions.

Long-term Planning Questions To ask Ourselves

How long do I think I will live?
Where do I want to live-or can I live?
What is my health status?
How am I caring for myself?
Have I done the legal work?
Am I managing my information?
How much money will I have?
How much money will I need?
What care do I want?

Who will care for me?

The best time to think about long term care is now - BEFORE you need it. No surprise there!!

It is never too late to start planning and talking!

Risk Factors That Can Predict The Need For Long Term Care

Age - risk increases as people get older Gender - women at higher risk than men often live longer

Having a disability

Marital status - single people more likely to need paid care

Lifestyle - poor diet and exercise habits can increase a person's risk

Present health-having a chronic illness like diabetes or arthritis

Family health history - Alzheimer's, cancer, stroke, heart disease etc.

Mobility issues - inability to walk or transfer

Major physical injuries - broken hip, knee Living alone - couples tend to care for each other as they age.

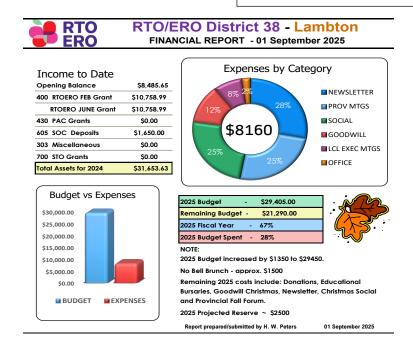

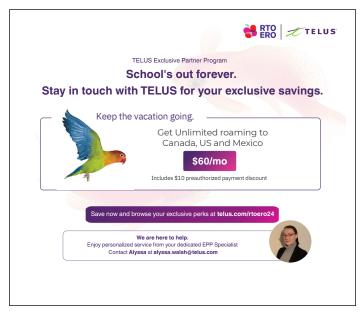
